



Protecting our Nation's Hearing and Vision



The UK National Eye-health and Hearing Study (UKNEHS) is the first of its kind in the UK to try and establish the extent of undetected vision and hearing loss and disease in the community.



Your household is one of 500 randomly selected across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough to be invited to take part in a NHS project that includes a free specialist vision and hearing examination.

Whatever your vision or hearing status, we'd be grateful if you would consider taking part in this important national project. Even if you are regularly seen by an optician or hospital, or you feel you have no problem with your vision or hearing, we hope that you will take part.

If participants are found to have a new or previously undetected vision or hearing problem, they will be referred, via the appropriate local pathway, to receive further support. The study has the support of local GPs.

We will be thanking those who participate with a voucher for £20, and everyone who has taken part will receive a report at the end of the study.

Over the next couple of weeks, you will receive a visit by the study team.

The 5-10 minute visit is simply to explain the study personally and if there are members of your household that are 50 years of age or older, to invite them to take part.
